Keynsham Eco competition

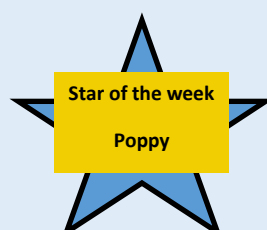

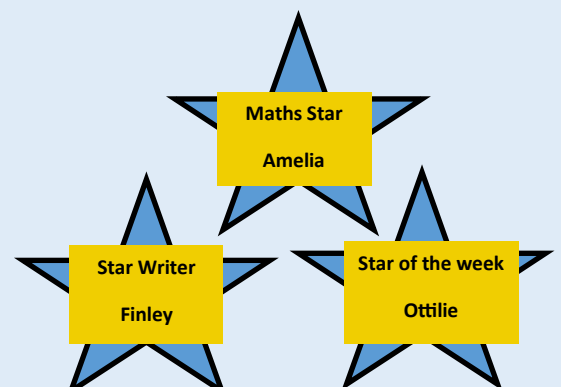
